Weather

The frost we had during the first half of May do not seem to have done much damage to the potato crops on both sides of Girvan. Not like the night in 1985 when our own Munro Clark was out during the night watering his crop to stop it from oblivion. Judging by the forecast we may still get some more frost before the month is out -in spite of the temperature reaching 24.8°C (77°F) on the 22nd. A cold snap around mid May is not so unusual and the blame for this was St. Dunstan. He was the Archbishop of Canterbury from 959 until his death on May 19th, 988. Despite his scholarship and the expansion of the monasteries, legends grew about Dunstan’s dealings with Satan. One told how Dunstan in his youth ran a brewery and how, faced with stiff competition from a local cider maker, his beer sales plummeted. In desperation, Dunstan made a pact with the Devil to have a frost strike in late spring each year to ruin the apple blossom of the Cider maker. The Devil kept his word and brought a severe frost every year around the time of St. Dunstan’s day on May 19th. Dunstan was also a skilled blacksmith in his early days, and another story concerned the Devil, who was so enraged by Dunstan’s preaching that he visited his forge at Glastonbury disguised as a young women to tempt him. But a gust of wind revealed the Devil’s hoofs and Dunstan picked up a red-hot pair of tongs and tweaked the Devil’s nose, sending him packing. As a result, blacksmiths put up a horseshoe over their workshops to ward off the Devil, and so began the superstition of hanging a lucky horseshoe over a door.

CARDINAL PUNCH
